

Inland Port Grants Benefit Mallard-Fox Creek River **Port Facilities**

The Decatur-Morgan County Port Authority received two grants from Governor Kay Ivey and the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs (ADECA). The grants were awarded from funds Senator Arthur Orr added to the state's new Alabama Inland Port Infrastructure Program that will increase waterway traffic, reduce highway traffic, and help industries dependent upon navigable water routes to ship finished products and import raw materials.

The \$2,100,000 in grant funding will assist in the construction of two new warehouses adding an additional 70,000 square feet of indoor storage at the port. The estimated total investment in the new facilities is expected to be \$3,300,000.





Morgan Center Business Park Redesignated as an **AdvantageSite**

Morgan Center Business Park, located at I-65 and Thompson Road in Hartselle, AL, recently received redesignation as an Alabama AdvantageSite by the Economic Development Partnership of Alabama. The site was first certified as an AdvantageSite in 2012, the year of the park's Ribbon Cutting ceremony. AdvantageSite is an industrial site preparedness program designed to make Alabama more competitive for companies considering relocating to the state. The community submitting for designation/redesignation of a site in their area, must provide many sources of documentation such as letters from utility companies serving the site confirming their capability of service, availability

of the site and ownership information, and environmental and geotechnical data. The last redesignation, prior to 2020, was in 2016. Paperwork is submitted every four years to maintain the designation.





Carolyn Poovey Retires from MCEDA

Carolyn Poovey retired in September 2020 from MCEDA/Decatur-Morgan County Port Authority after 32 years of service. Carolyn was hired by Tommy Ed Roberts in April 1988 to be the Financial Administrator, specifically, to handle the oversite of the financial matters. related to the construction of the Mallard-Fox Creek Industrial Park. She was witness to many milestone additions to the Morgan County industrial base, such as Daikin America, Toray Composite and Fluorofibers, Nucor Steel & the construction of Morgan Center Business Park. Morgan County Workforce in 2020

Supporting the regional workforce looked a little different in 2020. In March, MCEDA partnered with several groups to host another successful Second Chance Career Fair. Employers and job seekers both appreciated this targeted effort and MCEDA hopes to continue these events in the future. MCEDA also promoted the Upwards Alabama Regional Virtual Career Fair after the onset of lockdown to support furloughed job seekers. Horizon Point Consulting administered the annual Wage Survey in combination with Madison, Limestone, and Lawrence counties. This year's data also included benefit information as well. Vice President Penny Townson completed the TVA Workforce course with emphasis on framing the local workforce for recruitment and retention and building up the workforce pipeline.

As a result of COVID-19, annual retention visits were cut short. However, MCEDA continued conversations virtually where possible and remains available and committed to building up our local companies.
