Port Authority Receives \$3.2 Million for Three New Warehouses



Thanks to Senator Arthur Orr, the Decatur-Morgan County Port Authority received over \$3.2 million in grant funding from ADECA and ARC for the construction of three new warehouses at Mallard-Fox Creek Port Terminal. The over \$5 million warehouse complex will increase storage capacity for cottonseed, alloys, automotive grade steel, and aerospace materials. All the warehouses should be completed and in use by the end of 2022.

Cerrowire to Build \$100 Million Facility at Morgan Center Business Park



Cerrowire, LLC announced on November 9th they will be constructing a \$103 million dollar facility and creating approximately 130 jobs at the Morgan Center Business Park in Hartselle. This project was made possible by the tireless efforts of our partners at TVA, Hartselle Utilities, Joe Wheeler EMC, the State of Alabama, the Cooperative District, the City of Hartselle, and the Morgan County Commission. Thank you all!

Using \$20,000 in grant funding from the State of Alabama, the Lynn Fowler Board Room now has a full technology upgrade to keep us competitive in these changing times to include three flatscreens, integrated computer, wireless capability, and video conferencing.

MCEDA also worked with Decatur-Morgan Hospital to facilitate vaccine rollout among the manufacturers in Morgan County. Other partnerships of note are the Hartselle Chamber, TVA, North Alabama Works, AIDT and RTP, Decatur-Morgan County Chamber of Commerce, Calhoun Community College, Limestone Correctional Facility, and Morgan County Community Corrections.
